Current Situation: Some large fires displayed renewed activity as a result of warmer and drier conditions. Initial attack activity also increased slightly. Demobilization through NICC has decreased.

Eastern Great Basin Area Large Fires:

THUNDERBOLT, Boise NF. The fire made runs in heavy fuel, threatening the south fork of the Salmon River drainage.

CORRAL CREEK/BLACKWELL COMPLEX, Payette NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Lee) is assigned. Good progress continued to be made toward containment.

CHICKEN COMPLEX, Payette NF. Rehabilitation of fire lines and demobilization of resources continued. Fire activity was minimal.
