Current Situation: Large fire and initial attack activity increased in the Western Great Basin yesterday. The remainder of the West continues to experience normal levels of initial attack activity.

South Zone California Large Fires:

DAWSON, Riverside Ranger Unit, California State. Base camp has been broken down. Much of the overhead and equipment has been reassigned to the Pilgrim fire.

TECATE 10, San Bernardino Ranger Unit, California State. Forty acres of this fire are in the U.S. The international border, terrain and water availability remain the control problems.

PILGRIM, San Bernardino Ranger Unit, California State. Good progress is being made in all divisions. Resource releases are expected within the next 24 hours.

DANN, Elko District BLM. A Type II incident management team (Casey) is assigned. Crews are engaged in protecting livestock and structures at the Dann and other nearby ranches.

FYE CANYON, Battle Mountain District BLM. This lightning caused fire spread rapidly and erratically from sage brush into heavy pinyon stands.
