Outlook: Strong high pressure continues over the desert Southwest. The northern states will have a westerly flow with a weak weather disturbance moving through Montana, and another weak disturbance moving into western Washington. Clouds and rain will linger over Montana with an increasing chance of rain for western Washington. Isolated thunderstorms are expected over eastern Oregon and the Sierra Mountains of California. Very hot and dry conditions will continue in Arizona, Nevada and California with hot conditions in New Mexico and Utah. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's in western Washington and Oregon, and from 110 to 120 in the desert Southwest. The remainder of the West will have highs in the 80's and 90's. Initial attack activity is expected to continue, while the potential for escaped fires is increasing throughout the West.
