Current Situation: Moderate initial attack activity continued to be reported in most areas. A Type I Incident Management Team was mobilized in the Great Basin. Resource mobilization increased through NICC with 9 crews, one type I and one type II helicopter sent to South Zone California. A type I helicopter, radio system, caterer, shower and other misc. equipment were mobilized to the Eastern Great Basin. Numerous units in the Southwest, Great Basin, Rocky Mountain and California continue to report very high and extreme fire indices. Several units in the Northwest are reporting very high indices.

Eastern Great Basin Large Fires:

LAKES, Boise NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Monahan) is committed. The fire is currently threatening the Rocky Bar area. The fire spread rapidly, spotting and exhibiting erratic fire behavior through insect diseased sub-alpine timber.

A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR SOUTHEAST OREGON, SOUTHERN IDAHO OUTLOOK: AND SOUTHWEST WYOMING DUE TO STRONG WINDS AND DRY LIGHTNING. A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR MOST OF WYOMING FOR STRONG WINDS, LOW HUMIDITIES AND ISOLATED DRY LIGHTNING. A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN CENTRAL AND EASTERN MONTANA FOR GUSTY WINDS, LOW HUMIDITIES AND WIDELY SCATTERED THUNDERSTORMS. A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR MOST OF NEVADA FOR STRONG WINDS. A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR THE UPPER SACRAMENTO VALLEY AND SURROUNDING FOOTHILLS FOR GUSTY NORTH WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITIES TONIGHT. An upper level low pressure system should be moving into eastern Washington, Oregon and northern Idaho today. An associated coldfront will push into the western Idaho border and trail back across northern California by noon. This system is expected to produce windy conditions in Nevada, northern California, Oregon, Idaho and Wyoming. Scattered thunderstorms may be ahead of and along with the front, bringing some dry lightning. Cooler temperatures, higher humidities, some scattered showers and breezy conditions will follow behind the front. Afternoon thunderstorms are also expected in the mountains of Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, eastern Utah, Wyoming and Montana. Initial attack activity is expected to increase with the potential for escaped fires with forecasted warning and watches.
