Current Situation: Cooler temperatures and higher humidities have limited new fires to initial attack in the Northwest and Great Basin Areas. Monsoon moisture in the Southwest has helped limit new starts in that area.

Eastern Area Large Fires:

SAG CORRIDOR, Superior NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Tarbell) is committed. Approximately 250 people have been evacuated from their residences. The fire has burned across the border and will be suppressed under Unified Command with Canada.

CAMP WILLIAMS, Utah State. The fire received some rain yesterday from passing thunderstorms. The fire reported no significant activity due to cooler temperatures and higher humidities.

OUTLOOK: An upper level trough of low pressure will cover the Pacific Northwest and Northern Rockies. California and the Great Basin will experience a dry southwesterly flow of air. Monsoon moisture continues to cover the desert Southwest and the Southern Rockies. Clouds and a few showers will extend from Washington and northern Oregon into northern Idaho and western Montana. Dry and warmer weather is expected from California and Nevada into southern Idaho and western Wyoming. Scattered afternoon and evening showers and thundershowers are forecast for Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, eastern Utah and southeast Wyoming. High temperatures will range from the 60's and 70's in the Pacific northwest to the 80's and 90's in the Great Basin and California. The Southwest Deserts could reach 117 degrees. Gusty southwest to west winds are possible in the Pacific Northwest and Northern Rockies. Moderate fire activity is expected to continue.
