Current Situation: Most Geographic Areas continued to experience initial attack activity. Large fire activity increased in the Northern Rockies Area with two Type II Incident Management Teams mobilized internally. Good progress was made on several fires in the Great Basin and the Northwest Areas with containment objectives being met. Resource mobilization through NICC continued at a moderate pace. Nine Type I crews will be demobilized from Canada today. The Command and General Staff of the Southern Area Type II Incident Management Team has been activated to set up a Receiving and Distribution Center in St. Thomas on the Virgin Islands to support FEMA operations.

Northwest Area Large Fires:

CHELAN COMPLEX, Wenatchee N.F. A Type I Incident Management Team (Wands) is assigned. The complex consists of four fires, the Prince, Pot Peak, and two other small fires. The fires are burning in steep, inaccessible terrain on the east side of Lake Chelan.

OVERHOLD, Malheur N.F. Good progress was made on the fire yesterday.

OUTLOOK: A persistent low pressure system over western Washington will spin moisture slowly eastward bringing scattered clouds and showers across Washington, northern Oregon, northern Idaho and northwestern Isolated thunderstorms will occur mainly over the mountains of Washington and Oregon. Temperatures will be cooler as the low slowly drifts eastward. The remainder of the West will be under high pressure that will remain anchored over the southern Rockies. Monsoon moisture flowing northward along the western side of the high pressure system will be enhanced by moisture from Hurricane Henriette off of Baja California. This will result in scattered thundershowers across Arizona, southern California, southern Utah, western Colorado and western New Mexico. A cold front will move southward through eastern Montana and Wyoming bringing widely scattered showers and Southern Oregon, southwest Idaho, northern California, thundershowers. Nevada and Utah will remain mostly sunny and dry. Initial attack activity is expected to remain high as thunderstorms continue and holdover fires are detected.
