Current Situation: Fire activity remained moderate in the West. Progress continues in meeting containment objectives in the Northwest and Western Great Basin Area large fires. Demobilization of out of area resources from the Northwest and Great Basin will begin today.

Hurricane Marilyn Support:

Resource mobilization in support of relief operations in the Caribbean continues. The Southern Area has mobilized 252 overhead personnel to Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands for the relief effort. The Type I (O'Bannon) and the Type II (Kearney) Incident Management Teams have been tasked with setting up receiving and distribution centers on St. Thomas and St. Croix, respectively. The distribution of relief supplies is being delayed in Puerto Rico due to logistical problems with transporting supplies to the Virgin Islands. The situation is expected to improve in the next few days. Several aircraft are enroute to transport supplies and shuttle personnel between the islands.

A stationary front extends from southwest Wyoming, across west central Idaho and into central Washington. Chilly temperatures remain in Wyoming and Montana and scattered rain showers in Wyoming. Strong high pressure remains along the Pacific Coast providing very warm and dry conditions for parts of Washington and Oregon. High temperatures will reach only into the 40's and 50's across much of Montana and Wyoming. Seasonable weather prevails in the upper Great Basin, where highs will be mainly in the 70's. Hot weather remains in place from the northern California valleys to the desert Southwest, where temperatures will range from 100-110 degrees. The northeast states will experience weather much the same as yesterday, with high pressure bringing dry, cool conditions and temperatures in the 60's and 70's. Moderate fire activity is expected to continue in the West.
