Strong high pressure over Colorado and New Mexico will force a strong pressure gradient across southeast Arizona, producing east to southeast winds at 15-30 MPH. An upper level ridge stretching from the desert Southwest to Montana will provide dry weather through the interior West. An upper level trough will approach the Pacific Northwest coast bringing scattered showers and cooler temperatures to southeast Washington, Oregon and northern Idaho. The east slopes of the northern Rocky Mountains will have gusty southwest winds at 20-40 High temperatures will range from the 40's to near 60 degrees in the MPH. Northern Rockies. The Pacific coast will have temperatures in the 50's in Washington to the 70's along the southern California coast. The Great Basin will have highs in the 60's and 70's. Highs from the upper 80's to 100 degrees are expected from the California valleys to the desert Southwest. California and Arizona have the potential for fire activity due to very warm temperatures and Red Flag conditions in Arizona.
