OUTLOOK: A weak pressure gradient over California will generate dry weather and light winds through Saturday. A deep upper level trough will drop into the Northern Rockies on Sunday bringing cooler temperatures and breezy conditions to northern California. A slight chance of showers is forecast for the Sierra Nevada mountains on Sunday. High temperatures in northern California will be in the upper 40's to 50's in the mountains, reaching the 70's in the valleys. Southern California high temperatures will reach into the 60's in the mountains and lower 80's in the valleys. The potential for moderate fire activity continues in parts of California and the Southwest.
