INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

FRIDAY FEBRUARY 2, 1996 - 1000 MST NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION: Initial attack fire activity occurred in the Southern, Southwest and South Zone California Areas. The Eastern Area mobilized a short Type II Team to assist FEMA develop plans for setting up Service Centers in several flooded New York counties. The Forest Service and State of California assisted with a train derailment on Cajon Pass yesterday. The derailment caused a hazardous materials spill and several train cars to burn. Interstate 15 was closed due to the incident.

OUTLOOK: The Gulf Coast States will have a cold trough moving into Texas through Saturday and then moving eastward toward Georgia by Monday. This trough will bring rain, freezing rain, sleet and snow. A warmer westerly flow will return Tuesday through Thursday. High temperatures will range from the 20's in the north to the 40's in the south, warming to the 40's in the north to near 60 in the south by midweek. Florida will be mainly mild with cooler temperatures by Monday, then warming back up midweek. Southern California and Arizona will have a cool, dry northwest flow through Saturday. An upper level ridge will build over the area bringing dry and progressively warmer

temperatures by midweek. High temperatures will range from the 30's in the mountains to lower 70's in the southern deserts through Saturday, then warming to the 50's in the mountains to 80 in the southern deserts by midweek.
