INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 1996 - 0530 MST NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity continued in the Southern Area, with increased activity occurring in New Mexico. Resource mobilization through NICC consisted of radio equipment, a caterer, engines, airtankers, lead planes and miscellaneous overhead to the Southern and Southwest Areas. High to extreme fire dangers are being reported on numerous units in the Southern Area and burning bans are in effect in many counties in Arkansas and Texas.

Southern Area Fire Information:

TEXAS STATE FIRES. Approximately 24 fires for more than 1,300 acres burned actively yesterday. At least 13 counties are presently involved in active fire suppression. Volunteer Fire Departments are mainly responding with some support from the Texas Forest Service. Fire sizes are only estimates and resource commitments are extremely difficult to compile due to the variety of suppression forces involved. The fire near Poolville was contained at 15,000 acres. At least 41 homes and other structures were destroyed by the fire. Another 500 acre fire was reported to be burning off of Ft. Hood Military Reservation onto state and private lands.

ADA COMPLEX, Muskogee Area Office, Ada Agency, BIA. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bollman) is assigned. The Incident Management Team assumed initial attack responsibility for counties in the Seminole and Creek nations. Several new fires were reported within the complex yesterday. Three airtankers assisted with all the new activity yesterday. Homes, oil and gas facilities remain threatened.

UPLAND ISLAND, NF'S of Texas. Mop-up on the fire continued with burnout operations to secure lines. Concerns remain for structures in the area.

The fires were pushed by high winds yesterday (up to 80 MPH), causing long distance spotting. Fuels are primarily grass, Pinyon-Juniper and Ponderosa Pine with slash.
