CURRENT SITUATION: Fire activity decreased in most Areas yesterday. Very high fire indices continue in Colorado and southern California. Most units in the Southwest Area continue to experience very high to extreme fire danger. Resource mobilization through NICC remained minimal.

## Alaska Large Fires:

HIDDEN CREEK, Kenai National Wildlife Refuge and Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Dube) is assigned. Minimal activity occurred on the northern perimeter and crews used direct attack. Progress is slow due to heavy undergrowth and brush. Work along the eastern perimeter and around Upper Skilak campground was completed. Crews continued to secure the northern perimeter.

Alaska has 1 fire in confinement/limited strategy for 9,200 acres.
