CURRENT SITUATION: Moderate initial attack activity occurred in the Southwest and southern California. Very high fire indices continue in Colorado and southern California. Most units in the Southwest Area continue to experience very high to extreme fire danger. Resource mobilization through NICC remained minimal.

Alaska Large Fires:

HIDDEN CREEK, Kenai National Wildlife Refuge and Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Dube) is assigned. High humidity and overcast skies diminished fire activity allowing crews to secure northern perimeter and meet mop-up objectives on the eastern flank. Demob is scheduled to begin today.

Alaska has 1 fire in confinement/limited strategy for 14,300 acres.
