A chance of thunderstorms, mainly dry exists for the northern third of Arizona and along the Colorado border of New Mexico. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 15-35 MPH gusting to 45 MPH in the northern Arizona mountains. High temperatures will range from the 60's and 70's in the mountains to the 90's in the lower deserts. Southern Colorado will be partly to mostly cloudy, breezy and cooler with a chance of showers and thundershowers. High temperatures will range from the 60's to the 80's. Southern California will be partly cloudy and breezy with a chance of afternoon showers or thundershowers. Winds will be variable 15-25 MPH with afternoon gusts to 40 MPH in the interior deserts. High temperatures will range from the 60's to upper 80's. The potential for increased fire

activity exists with red flag and fire weather watches in the Southwest Area. An increase in human caused fires associated with the upcoming holiday weekend is possible.
