CURRENT SITUATION: Initial attack activity was minimal throughout the United States. Resource mobilization through NICC remained low.

OUTLOOK: **** A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED IN ARIZONA FOR DRY LIGHTNING. **** Arizona will be cloudy to mostly cloudy and warmer. Winds will be 15 to 35 MPH with minimum relative humidity from 15 to 25%. Monday will be drier with scattered rain and thundershowers. New Mexico will have cooler temperatures with snow possible above 7,000 feet. Southern New Mexico will be partly cloudy and breezy. Northern New Mexico will have variable clouds with showers and a few thunderstorms. Southern California will be partly cloudy to cloudy with a chance of showers and thundershowers. Temperatures will be cooler, winds will be 10 to 20 MPH, and minimum relative humidity will be 20 to 40%. Warmer temperatures will return Monday. Southern Colorado will have cooler temperatures and widely scattered thunderstorms. Minimum RH will be 40 to 50%. Warmer temperatures and drier conditions will return Monday. Fire activity may increase in the Southwest Area due to Red Flag warnings. The potential for increased human caused fires will remain throughout the holiday weekend.
