OUTLOOK: ***** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR NORTHERN AND EASTERN ARIZONA DUE TO INCREASING WINDS, LOW HUMIDITY AND LOW FUEL MOISTURE ***** An upper level trough along the Pacific Coast will bring locally windy conditions to southern California, Arizona and New Mexico. The northern portions of these areas will be mostly sunny and windy with breezy conditions in the southern portions. A slight chance of thunderstorms are possible in eastern Arizona and eastern New Mexico. High temperatures will range from the 70's to mid 80's in the mountains and from 90 to 100 in the deserts. A weak cold front will move into the northern part of Florida bringing partly cloudy skies and widely scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 80's to lower 90's. The potential for increased fire activity remains in the Southwest Area due to increasing winds.
