Rain will spread over Washington and northern Oregon today. Isolated mountain showers are forecast for Colorado and eastern Utah. A few afternoon thunderstorms are possible in central and southeast Arizona and western New Mexico. California will be mostly sunny, a little warmer and locally breezy. The desert Southwest will be unseasonably warm. High temperatures will range from the 50's and 60's in the Pacific Northwest and north and central Rocky Mountains. California will have highs in the 70's and 80's and the desert Southwest will be in the 90's to 100.
