# INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SATURDAY AUGUST 2, 1997 - 0900 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Sustained initial attack activity persisted in California and the Great Basin. Large fire activity continued in Alaska.

#### ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

SIMELS, Galena District, BLM. This fire is on the east side of the Innoko Flats, between Galena and McGrath. The slopover on the eastern perimeter increased by 200-300 acres and is contained. The Blue Cabin slopover received three hours of rain.

CHINIKLIK MOUNTAIN, Galena District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wehking) is assigned. The fire was very active on the north perimeter. The acreage decrease is due to remapping and subtracting green pockets.

INOWAK, Southwest Area Forestry, Alaska State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Dube) is assigned. The fire did not burn as aggressively due to cooler temperatures and overcast skies, but active burning continues on the north perimeter. Structure and native allotment protection continues at Georgetown.

BUTTE CREEK, Fairbanks Area Forestry, Alaska State. This fire is located 25 miles east of Eilson Air Force Base, near cabins on the Salcha River. Crews were delivered to the fire, to stop the fire's creeping progress toward private property. GARFIELD CREEK, Galena District, BLM. This fire is located on the Seward Peninsula, 65 miles north of Nome. An inversion layer obscured much of the fire. The fire increased in size by 20,000 acres.

MAGITCHLIE CREEK, Galena District, BLM. This fire is located in the Innoko Flats, 35 miles south of Kaltag. The initial burn-out objectives were completed. Further operations have been initiated to protect Fish and Wildlife Service sites.

DEVILS PEAK, Southwest Area Forestry, Alaska State. This fire is located west of the Kuskokwim River, 60 miles south of McGrath. Tentative demobilization is planned for 8/3.

### OUTLOOK:

California will have morning low fog and clouds along the coast, otherwise it will be mostly sunny statewide with a slight chance of thunderstorms over the mountains. Temperatures will be in the high 60's to 70's on the coast to upper 90's in the valleys.

Nevada will be mostly sunny. Temperature highs will be mid 90's to 90's except 110 in the deserts.

Utah will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms mainly near the mountains in northern Utah. Expect scattered thunderstorms in southern Utah. Temperatures will be in the mis 80's to mid 90's.

Alaska will be cloudy with showers likely along the coast. There is a chance of thunderstorms in the southern interior especially along the mountain ranges. Temperature highs will be in the 60's and 70's. The north interior will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Temperatures will be in the high 60's on the coast to near 80 in the interior valleys.

Oregon and Washington will be partly sunny west of the Cascades with morning low clouds and fog along the coast, with a slight chance of showers in northwest Washington. Temperatures will be in the 60's to 70's along the coast and in western Washington, and in the 80's in the inland valleys of Oregon. East of the Cascades will be partly cloudy with isolated thunderstorms mainly near the mountains in eastern Oregon and the extreme eastern part of Washington.
