INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT MONDAY AUGUST 18, 1997 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Containment objectives were achieved on all large fires in the Northwest and Eastern Basin Areas. Firefighters continue to make good progress on the Narrows fire in Southern California. Resource mobilization through NICC remained minimal. Very high and extreme fire indices continue to be reported on units in California, Nevada, Arizona and Oregon.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

NARROWS, ANGELES NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Hutchinson) is assigned. This fire is located four miles southwest of Wrightwood, CA. Successful burnout operations on the northeast flank have diminished the threat to Wrightwood. Line construction continues on the north and northeast divisions. A potential threat exists to organizational camps on the north side of the fire. Firefighter safety remains a concern due to extremely steep terrain.

OUTLOOK:

Western Washington will be mostly sunny with areas of patchy morning fog along the coast. Eastern Washington will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms in the south and isolated thunderstorms in the north.

Temperatures will range from 65 along the coast to the 90's in eastern Washington.

Oregon will be mostly sunny. A slight chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms exists from the Cascades to the eastern border, mainly over the mountains. Areas of morning fog are possible along the coast and in the northwestern interior. Temperatures will be in the 60's along the coast, the 80's in the north, and the 90's in the south.

California will be mostly sunny. The coastline and coastal valleys will have morning fog, low clouds and drizzle. Temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's along the coast, the 70's and 80's in the mountains and coastal valleys, the 80's and 90's in the interior valleys, and up to 104 in the deserts.

Utah will be partly cloudy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. Temperatures will range from the 70's in the north to the 90's in the south.

Nevada will be mostly sunny in the west and partly cloudy in the east. Isolated thunderstorms are forecast in the south and east-central portions of the state. Temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's in the north, and the 90's to 103 in the south.
