## INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT TUESDAY AUGUST 19, 1997 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Large fire activity continued in Southern California. Resource mobilization through NICC was minimal. Very high and extreme fire indices cont inue to be reported on units in California, Nevada, Arizona, Washington, Oregon and Louisiana.

### SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

NARROWS, ANGELES NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Hutchinson) is assigned. This fire is located four miles southwest of Wrightwood, CA. Aggressive fire behavior was observed yesterday. A slopover on Highway 2 is threatening organizational camps northwest of Wrightwood. Children at the camps were evacuated as a precautionary measure. Steep terrain continues to cause control problems.

SIERRA, Los Angeles County, California State. This fire is burning in dense fuels south of Santa Clarita near Newhall, CA. Structures in the community of Newhall are currently threatened. No other information was available.

#### OUTLOOK:

California will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms. Morning fog and low clouds are probable along the coast. Temperatures will ran ge from the 60's along the coast to 106 in the desert.

Washington will be mostly sunny with areas of patchy morning fog along the coast. Coastal temperatures will be in the 60's. Western high temperatures will be in the 80's, with eastern highs reaching the 90's.

Oregon will be mostly sunny with areas of morning fog along the coast and the northwestern interior. A slight chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms exists from the Cascades to the eastern border. Temperatures will be in the 60 's along the coast and the 90's and 100's in the deserts.

Utah will be mostly sunny in the north. The southern portion will be partly cloudy with a chance of afternoon thunderstorms over the mountains. Temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the north and the 80's and 90's in the south.

Nevada will be mostly sunny in the north with increasing clouds by afternoon. Partly cloudy conditions with increasing clouds are forecast for southern Nevada. A slight chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms exists for the central and southern portions of the state. Temperatures will range from the 80's in the north to 108 in the south.
