INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 1997 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION: Large fire activity continued in Southern California. Increased initial attack activity was reported in the Southern Area. Minimal fire activity occurred elsewhere. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported on several units in Southern California. Multiple units in the Western Great Basin and Northern Rockies Areas continue to report very high fire indices.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

WILDWOOD, San Bernardino Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. This fire is located 1/2 mile northeast of Yucaipa, CA. The fire is burning away from the homes in the Oak Glen area. No other information was available.

CITY CREEK, San Bernardino NF. The fire is 1/2 mile north of Highland, CA. Highway 330 is currently closed. No other information was available.

OUTLOOK:

California will be mostly sunny, dry and warmer than normal. Temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains, the 80's and 90's in the coastal valleys, and up to 105 in the interior valleys and deserts.

Washington and Oregon will be sunny and dry, with higher than normal temperatures. Highs will be in the 70's and 80's in Washington and the 80's and 90's in Oregon.

Nevada will have sunny conditions. Temperatures will range from the 70's in the north to the 90's in the south.

Montana will be sunny with dry conditions. Temperatures will be higher than normal, ranging from the 60's in the west to the 80's in the east.

Utah will be partly sunny. Temperatures will be in the 70's in the north, and the 80's and 90's in the south.

A cold front will drop to the south and extend from northern Georgia to southern Arkansas late this afternoon. This will bring mostly cloudy skies with a chance of showers and thunderstorms to the area. Temperatures will be in the 70's to the north of this front, and up to
