

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT

SUNDAY, JUNE 28, 1998 - 0900 MDT

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Last evening, Tanker 08, a P2V crashed while assigned to the Leggett fire on the Gila NF in New Mexico. There were no survivors. An accident investigation is underway. The entire fire community extends their sympathy to family, friends and co-workers of the flight crew.

Large fire activity continued in the Southern Area. Initial attack activity increased in the Southwest and Eastern Great Basin Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a Type II Incident Management Team, equipment, aircraft, and miscellaneous overhead for the Southern Area. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Florida, Georgia, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Utah, and Nevada.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

WITHLACOOTCHEE COMPLEX, Florida State Hernando, Pasco, Lake Summer, and Citrus Counties. A Type II Incident Management Team (Votolina) is assigned. This complex consists of seven uncontrolled and 17 controlled fires. Approximately 250 homes in Pasco County are threatened. No other information is available.

BUNNELL COMPLEX, Florida State, Flagler, Volusia, and St. Johns Counties. A North Carolina Incident Management Team (Hendricks) is assigned. These fires extend from Daytona Beach to St. Augustine. A voluntary evacuation is in effect for Pierson, Florida. Firefighters continue to work toward containment objectives.

OAK HEAD COMPLEX, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Greenhoe) is assigned. This fire is 20 miles north of Lake City. Activity on the Oak Head fire increased as drying conditions and scattered thunderstorms prevailed over the area. Firefighters have made good progress on line construction.

SUWANNEE COMPLEX, Florida State, Columbia, Union, Bradford and Baker Counties. A Type I Incident Management Team (Wands) is assigned. A Unified Command is in effect. One uncontained fire remains in this complex. Thunderstorms in the vicinity caused extreme burning conditions and strong winds. Firefighters were able to hold the lines on all the fires.

LEGGETT, Gila NF. This fire is 8 miles west of Reserve. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamonte) is assigned. No other information is available.

RIM TANK, Coronado NF. This fire is 45 miles northeast of Tucson. The fire is a slopover from a prescribed fire.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

CARLA LAKE, Fort Greely Army Base. This fire is 15 miles southwest of Delta Junction. Warm and dry conditions produced several hot-spots with occasional torching

of interior pockets. Firefighters continued to make excellent progress toward suppression objectives. Rehabilitation efforts are going well.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED FOR DRY CONDITIONS IN NORTH FLORIDA. A HEAT ADVISORY HAS BEEN ISSUED IN GEORGIA. Florida and Georgia will be hot and dry with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Temperatures will be in the 90's to near 100.

Breezy, hot and dry conditions will dominate Nevada, southern Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, and Texas. Showers and thunderstorms are predicted along the Texas coast. Winds will be 10-20 MPH for most of this area. Nevada and Utah will have winds at 15-25 MPH. Temperatures will range from the 80's in the mountains and from 95 to 110 in the valleys and deserts.
