INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SATURDAY, AUGUST 1, 1998 - 0900 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack and large fire activity continued in the Northwest Area, Texas and Eastern Great Basin. The rest of the nation reported minimal activity. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a helicopter, equipment, engines, crews and overhead. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Michigan, Arizona, Nevada, Idaho, California and Washington.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

OMAK LAKE COMPLEX, Colville Agency BIA. A Type II Incident Management Team (Solarz) is assigned. This complex is located near Electric City. No structures are threatened. No new information was reported.

CLEVELAND, Washington State. This fire is located twenty miles northeast of Goldendale in Klickitat County. The fire is very active inside the perimeter and a wind event could threaten control. Precipitation has helped containment efforts.

ELK MEADOWS, Department of Energy. This fire is located on State Highway 240 near the Hanford Nuclear site. The highway has been closed due to burnout operations along the roadway. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

WHITE PASS COMPLEX, Gifford Pinchot NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This complex is located at White Pass Ski Area and consists of ten fires, the largest being two hundred fifty acres. White Pass Ski Area continues to be threatened. Crews are making progress and are limiting line construction in the wilderness.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRE:

TILDEN #2, Idaho Falls District BLM. This fire is located ten miles northwest of Blackfoot. Extremely heavy fuel loading and thunderstorms with strong erratic winds caused control problems. Burnout operations are continuing. The fire has burned through power lines and standing grain fields. It has the potential to threaten numerous structures and outbuildings.

BURNT, Salt Lake District BLM. This fire is located eighty miles southwest of Salt Lake City. A frontal passage pushed the fire to the east and south causing it to make strong runs in heavy juniper and sage. Limited engine access, steep terrain and heavy continuous fuels hampered control efforts.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRE:

PINES, Lewistown District BLM. This fire is located at the Pines Recreation Area. Midmorning, southeast winds drove the fire into thick timber. Retardant and ground crews managed to stop northwest and eastern expansion.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BEAR MOUNTAIN COMPLEX, Oklahoma State. A Unified Command structure is in place and a Type II Incident Management Team (Bollman) is assigned. Containment for previously reported fires has been achieved and forces continue to mop-up and patrol. The Incident Management Team is assisting with numerous uncontained arson starts which are occurring on adjacent state and private lands. One structure was lost. The Cut Through Fire, at 500 acres, is threatening a State Park, a museum, and a camp ground.

SUGAR LOAF, Texas State - Palo Pinto County. A large burnout was completed yesterday. Another burnout was planned for last night.

EXCOTA, Texas State - Fisher County. This fire is threatening oil tanks and buildings.

O BAR O, Texas State - Kent County. A burnout operation along a ranch road was planned for last night in order to prevent the evacuation of the town of Jayton (600+ people). The fire is also threatening an oil storage area and associated facilities. High winds, heavy oak, and juniper brush are contributing to control problems.

MUD FIRE, Big Thicket National Preserve. This fire is burning in a remote area, in hardwoods, leaf litter, pockets of very thick brush and downfall created by the infestation of the Southern Pine Beetle.

PINEY CR., Texas State. Two homes have been lost, sixty homes are threatened and thirty homes have been evacuated. This fire was started by trash burning.

NEW HOPE, Texas State - Rusk County. The fire continued to spot over containment lines last night. Containment was expected 7/31.

OUTLOOK:

Scattered mostly wet thunderstorms are expected in New Mexico, northeast Utah, eastern and northwest Colorado, eastern Idaho, Montana and Wyoming, dry elsewhere. High temperatures will range from 70's to 80's in the mountains and from 90-115 in the valleys and deserts. High temperatures in the Great Basin and Northern Rockies will be in the 60's in the mountains to the lower 80's in the valleys.

There is a heat advisory for portions of Arkansas, Texas and Oklahoma. Texas will be mostly sunny and hot with a chance of thunderstorms in west Texas. High temperatures will be 95 to 108.

Oklahoma and Arkansas will be partly cloudy, hot and humid with a chance of thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from the upper 80's to 105.

Michigan will be mostly sunny with temperatures in the 70's to lower 80's.
