

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, AUGUST 8, 1998 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack fire activity increased in the Great Basin and Northern Rockies. Moderate initial attack activity was reported elsewhere. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for caterers, showers, crews, helicopters, equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Montana, South Dakota, Washington, Oregon and California.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

NORTH 25, Wenatchee NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This fire is located 35 miles northwest of Chelan. Burn-out operations on the east flank were successful in diminishing the threat to structures. A road and trail closure is in effect for the fire area and the Twenty Five-Mile Creek State Park remained closed yesterday.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRE:

COPPER CREEK, Helena NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bullis/Suenram) is assigned. This fire is approximately 45 miles northwest of Helena. Current threats are to Bull Trout spawning habitat and recreational facilities. Steep slopes and a high number of snags are causing control and safety problems. Objectives are to keep the fire from burning into the Scapegoat Wilderness.

CRANE CREEK CANYON, Boise District BLM. This fire is located fourteen miles northeast of Weiser. Steep terrain is making access to the fire difficult. Heavy fuels and adverse weather continue to govern the progress of containment.

NORTH RIM COMPLEX, Grand Canyon NP. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kleindienst) is assigned. This fire is located 80 miles northwest of Flagstaff. Rehabilitation began yesterday on the Widforss Trail, Transept fire and the Swamp Lake spike camp. Demobilization will begin tomorrow along with a continued mop-up and rehabilitation effort.

Oklahoma and Arkansas will be partly cloudy and hot with a few showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 80's to upper 90's.
