

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, AUGUST 24, 1998 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity increased in the Great Basin yesterday. Initial attack activity was high in the Northern Rockies and Northwest Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a mobile caterer and shower unit, aircraft, equipment, crews and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme indices were reported in Texas, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Oregon, California, Arizona, South Dakota and Colorado.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

SPRING, Central Land Office, Montana State. This lightning caused fire is burning in a roadless area 40 miles north of Helena. Good progress was made on the fire yesterday. A small amount of precipitation aided suppression efforts.

PACK TRAIL, Bitterroot NF. This fire is located 10 miles east of Sula. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cowin) is assigned. The east flank continues to actively burn as crews continue to make progress along the west flank. Demobilization has begun.

WEST FORK WILDERNESS FIRES, Bitterroot NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (Wallace) is assigned. Minor activity occurred due to overcast, lower temperatures and higher relative humidities.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

LAID LOW, Salmon-Challis NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Carr) has been assigned. This fire is burning in an area of heavy bug kill 12 miles northwest of Stanley. High winds are causing containment problems.

PARIS PEAK, Caribou NF. This fire is located seven miles west of Paris. High winds caused the fire to escape containment lines. Retardant was ineffective due to heavy fuels and high winds. Dozer access is limited due to terrain. The fire is currently threatening a timber sale area and is near a timber blow down area.

NORTH FORK COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Richer) is assigned. These fires are located approximately 20 miles northwest of Salmon. The Long Tom fire has been contained. A slopover

occurred on the Sheepeater fire but was successfully controlled by helicopters and hand crews. High winds continue to hamper firefighting efforts on the Upper Ebb. The Horse Creek Butte, Little Cayuse, Baby Cayuse and Broomtail fires, all in the Frank Church River of No Return wilderness remain unstaffed.

MAIN SALMON COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (O'Brien) is assigned. This complex is 40 miles west northwest of Salmon. The complex consists of 14 fires burning in the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness on the Salmon-Challis, Payette, Nez Perce and Bitterroot National Forests. Strong winds associated with a cold front passage increased activity in areas exposed to the winds. Cooler temperatures, higher relative humidity and isolated showers decreased activity elsewhere. A burnout is planned for Gattin Ranch.

JACKASS, Salmon-Challis NF. This fire is 30 miles southwest of Salmon. No new information was received. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

MM272, Northern Region, Nevada State. This fire is burning in sage and grass 36 miles east of Battle Mountain. Structure engines are currently protecting two structures.

BOULDER VALLEY, Elko District, BLM. The fire is located 25 miles north of Battle Mountain. Strong winds pushed the fire into gullies, steep terrain, and heavy fuels limiting engine access. Additional crews and engines have been ordered.

OUTLOOK:

A southwesterly flow aloft will exist over the northern half of the western United States with an upper level ridge of high pressure over the southern tier of the West. Montana will have scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Drier air will spread into Washington, Oregon and Idaho. Scattered afternoon thunderstorms will prevail over portions of Arizona, New Mexico, and the southern portions of Utah and Colorado. California and Nevada will remain dry. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the coastal and mountain locations with 90's to 108 elsewhere.
