

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, AUGUST 29, 1998 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity remained minimal. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for helicopters, equipment and overhead. Very high to extreme indices were reported in Texas, Arizona, Utah, Nevada, California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Wyoming and South Dakota.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

WEST FORK WILDERNESS FIRES, Bitterroot NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (Wallace) is assigned. All fires exhibited increased activity with higher temperatures.

MOOSE COMPLEX, Nez Perce NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. These fires are located in the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness. The fires are being managed to enhance the natural ecological condition of the wilderness.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

LAIID LOW, Salmon-Challis NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Carr) is assigned. This fire is burning in an area of heavy bug kill 12 miles northwest of Stanley. Crews continued to work on containment and burnout activities. The fire threatens to escape the original Wildland Fire Situation Analysis boundary.

MAIN SALMON COMPLEX, Salmon-Challis NF. An Interagency Fire Use Management Team (Zimmerman) is assigned. This complex is 40 miles west northwest of Salmon. The complex consists of 16 fires in the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness on the Salmon-Challis, Payette, Nez Perce and Bitterroot National Forests. The Arctic, Cayuse Creek, Colt and Hidden Lake fires were active yesterday. Minimal activity occurred on the remaining fires.

BEARSKIN CREEK, Boise NF. This fire is burning in down lodgepole pine and sub alpine fir north of Lowman. The fire made a minor run to the north. Extreme fire behavior occurred with torching and spotting. Airtankers and helicopter bucket drops aided hand crews with suppression efforts.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN EASTERN WASHINGTON FOR A HIGH HAINES INDEX AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY. Near record high temperatures with isolated, dry thunderstorms are forecast over the mountains of Idaho, Montana and southern Utah. Isolated to scattered wet thunderstorms are expected in New Mexico and Arizona. High temperatures will range from 95 to 115 in the valleys and deserts, with 80's to the lower 90's in the mountains and Northern Rockies.
