

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 1998 - 0530 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity remained minimal. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a helicopter, equipment, shower, type I crew and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Nebraska, South Dakota, Idaho, Montana, Washington and Oregon.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

BEAR TRAP, Montana State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Swope) is assigned. This fire is burning in grass, sagebrush and timber 15 miles northeast of Ennis. Strong winds caused spotting over the fireline. Airtankers and helicopters were effective in holding the spots.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRE:

BUCK, Six Rivers NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hoppis) is assigned. This fire is burning in extremely rough and inaccessible terrain 15 miles south southeast of Gasquet. The fire has established itself in two drainages and has a very irregular perimeter. A 50 acre spot fire was detected north of the main fire.

CEDAR CREEK, Klamath NF. This fire is 12 miles north northwest of Somes Bar. This was a prescribed fire which escaped containment lines over the last few days. No major problems are anticipated.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR GUSTY WEST WINDS EAST OF THE ROCKIES AND WEST OF INTERSTATE 15 IN NORTHERN MONTANA.

The western U.S. will be mostly sunny and warm. New Mexico, Colorado and southern Wyoming will have scattered showers and thunderstorms. There will be gusty west winds along the front range of the Rockies. Northwest Nevada and eastern Oregon will have isolated thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from the 70's to 80's, and up to 100 in the southwestern deserts.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be mostly cloudy with afternoon showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will in the 80's.
