

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 1998 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal initial attack activity was reported. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a Type I Incident Management Team, five Type 1 crews, equipment and miscellaneous overhead to help support relief efforts for damage caused by Hurricane Georges. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, Idaho, Montana, Washington and Oregon.

OUTLOOK:

High pressure will build over the Pacific Northwest and Great Basin bringing dry and warm weather. An upper level low will move across Montana bringing scattered showers and a few thunderstorms. Utah, Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico will have isolated mountain showers and thunderstorms. An upper level low will develop along the northern California coast bringing dry, but cooler temperatures. Isolated afternoon thunderstorms are possible over the Sierra Mountains. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's in the northern tier states and the 80's and 90's in the south.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be partly cloudy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's to lower 90's.
