# INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT FRIDAY, OCTOBER 2, 1998 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

#### CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal initial attack activity was reported. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Nebraska, Texas, Nevada, Oregon and Montana.

## SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS:

HURRICANE GEORGES: Birch's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Roosevelt Roads Naval Base in Puerto Rico. The Team continues to support FEMA efforts on the Island. The Team has processed 970,000 pounds of ice, 820,000 gallons of water, 3,000 cots, 11,000 blankets and 28,000 rolls of plastic and building supplies.

Wand's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center in Montgomery, AL. The team is receiving a steady flow of relief supplies for hurricane victims. Supplies at the center include cots, Meals Ready to Eat (MRE's), blankets, water, ice, generators, toilets and chainsaws. The Center is shipping supplies out to FEMA Disaster Field Offices. The Center has received 126 truck loads since 9/27.

Bennett's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Camp Beauregard in Pineville, LA. The Team had limited activity at the center again yesterday. Some demobilization occurred; further use of the center has not yet been determined.

#### OUTLOOK:

A strong cold front will move into the Pacific Northwest and Northern Rockies bringing cooler temperatures with areas of rain and mountain snow to Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana. Wyoming, Colorado and New Mexico will have scattered showers and thunderstorms. The extreme northern portions of California, northern Nevada and northern Utah will have a few showers along with gusty winds. The remainder of California, southern Nevada, southern Utah and Arizona will be sunny and warm with locally gusty winds. High temperatures in the West will range from the 50's to

mid 60's in the northern states, 70's to mid 80's in California, and mid 80's to upper 90's in the desert Southwest.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be partly cloudy, warm and breezy with a chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's to mid 90's.
