CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a type III helicopter and miscellaneous overhead. Very high fire indices were reported in California and Oregon.

OUTLOOK:

A Pacific cold front will bring showers along the Pacific Northwest coast and snow over the Cascades. Widely scattered rain and snow showers will move east of the Cascades into western Montana, mainly over the mountains and near the Canadian border. The remainder of the West will be mostly sunny, but cooler in Washington and Oregon. Elsewhere it will be continue to be unseasonably warm. High temperatures will range from the 50's and 60's in the mountains and Northwest coast, 60's and 70's in the inland valleys and 80's and 90's in the lower southwest valleys.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be mostly sunny and continued unseasonably warm. High temperatures will be in the 80's, except 90's or near 100 in southwestern Texas.
