INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT TUESDAY, OCTOBER 20, 1998 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity continued in Southern California and the Southwest Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for an airtanker, four helicopters and miscellaneous overhead. High to extreme fire indices were reported in California.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

OGILVY, Los Padres NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (McClain) is assigned. This fire is 13 miles northeast of Santa Barbara in the Dick Smith Wilderness. The California Red Legged Frog and Arroyo Toad habitat remain threatened. Heavy fuels and steep rocky terrain are safety concerns for firefighters. Air resources are critical in mitigating these concerns. The fire was active throughout the day yesterday making large runs toward Loma Peloma Peak.

PIRU, Ventura County, California. A Type II Incident Management Team (Festerling) is assigned. This fire is burning in heavy brush west of Castaic near Lake Piru. The fire burned ten miles to the west, causing mandatory evacuations of homes on the outskirts of Fillmore. Steep terrain and strong winds are contributing to rapid rates of spread. The California Condor Sanctuary is 5 miles to the north.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BS, Gila NF. A Type I Incident Management Team (Bateman) is assigned. This fire is 18 miles south of Reserve. Burnout operations were successful yesterday afternoon. Rehabilitation of dozer lines has been completed and some hand line was also accomplished. Mop up efforts are continuing. A 15 acre slopover was lined.

RAEL, Gila NF. This fire is 12 miles south of Aragon. Containment was expected last night. Demobilization will start today.

OUTLOOK:

A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED IN THE NORTHERN SACRAMENTO VALLEY FOOTHILLS AND WESTERN SLOPES OF THE NORTHERN SIERRAS FOR GUSTY NORTHEAST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY.

Strong high pressure continues to build over the Pacific Northwest and northern Great Basin bringing warmer and drier weather with gusty east winds over the Oregon Cascades and coastal range. An upper level low will be over southern California keeping conditions dry with a few clouds in the mountains in the southern and central portions of the state. Northern California will have gusty east to northeast winds and low humidities. Idaho and western Montana will also be warmer and drier. Moisture will continue to move northward from Mexico into the Southwest Area. New Mexico will have mostly cloudy skies with scattered showers and high mountain snow possible. Arizona will be partly cloudy with isolated showers. High temperatures will range from the 40's and 50's in the Rockies, 60's and 70's in the Pacific Northwest and Great Basin to the 70's and 80's in the Southwest, California and southern Nevada.

Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be cloudy with rain likely. High temperatures will be in the 60's and lower 70's.
