

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 FRIDAY, MARCH 05, 1999 - 1000 MST  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack and large fire activity increased in the Southern Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders from the Southern Area for single engine airtankers, lead planes, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Several units in the Southwest Area are reporting very high and extreme fire indices.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

TIGER, Francis Marion & Sumter NF's. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned.

FERRY COMPLEX, Florida NF's. The fires in this complex are located around the community of Silver Springs. New starts continue to be discovered within the area of the complex.

Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas will be windy through most of next week with scattered showers and thundershowers, except south Texas which will be fair. High temperatures will be in the mid 60's and 70's, cooling to the 50's and 60's Tuesday through Thursday.

The Southwest will be generally dry, except for a chance of rain and mountain snow over the weekend. Tuesday will be windy. High temperatures will be in the 30's and 40's in the mountains, to the 60's and 70's in the deserts.
