

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, MAY 3, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack and large fire activity continues in the Eastern and Southern Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for two cache vans, radio equipment, a lead plane, airtanker, single engine airtanker, air attack, four type I crews, 7 type II crews and miscellaneous overhead. The Southern Area also requested aircraft to transport 5 crews internally. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Florida, Georgia, Minnesota, Michigan, Maine, New Jersey, and Wisconsin.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

ATV, Huron/Manistee NF. This fire, started by an ATV is four miles southeast of Mio, MI. Numerous homes were evacuated, however no structures were lost.

UNHAPPY CAMPER, Huron/Manistee NF. This escaped campfire is 5 miles northeast of Glennie, MI. No further information was available.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

SHOP RUN, Shenandoah National Park. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. This fire is burning 20 miles northwest of Charlottesville, VA. High winds and snags are causing control problems. The fire jumped containment lines along the north and south perimeter. Current threats are to private lands to the east, recreation areas and watersheds.

OUTLOOK

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN FLORIDA FOR LOW HUMIDITIES. Florida will be sunny and warm. Minimum humidities will be 20-30 percent. Winds will be light and variable. High temperatures will be in the 70's to mid 80's.

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN NEW MEXICO FOR WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITIES. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a chance of showers. Winds will be westerly at 20-30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 50's to mid 60's in the mountains, and 70's to near 80 for the lower valleys.

A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR LOW HUMIDITIES AND WARM AND DRY CONDITIONS IN MICHIGAN. Michigan will be mostly sunny. Minimum humidities will be 15- 25 percent. Winds will be from the southeast at 10-20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 70's to the lower 80's.

Minnesota will be partly sunny with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be from the south at 15-25 MPH. High temperatures will be in the mid 60's to mid 70's.

Wisconsin will be partly sunny and breezy. Winds will be from the southeast at 5-25 MPH. High temperatures will be in the mid 60's to mid 70's, except near the lake where temperatures will be in the 50's.

New Jersey will be mostly cloudy with a chance of showers. Winds will be 15-30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 60's.
