INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SUNDAY, MAY 16, 1999 - 0900 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity continued in the Southwest Area. The Southern Area experienced large fire and increased initial attack activity. Good burning conditions and increased fire starts are expected in the Canadian Provinces of Ontario and Quebec through the weekend. Mobilization through the National Interagency Coordination Center was minimal. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Michigan, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Louisiana, Ontario and Quebec.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

TELEPHONE, Mescalero Agency BIA. This fire is located approximately 3 miles southeast of Mescalero, New Mexico. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamante) is assigned. Strong, gusty winds throughout yesterday did not cause major holding problems. However, numerous small spot fires were picked up outside the fireline.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BROWN FIRE, Everglades National Park. This fire is located near Homestead, Florida. Engines and ground personnel continued mop up and patrol efforts around the perimeter of the fire.

BONITA SPRINGS, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is located near Bonita Beach in Lee County. Some spotting was occurring across the containment lines yesterday afternoon and evening.

PLANTED PINES, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is located in Pasco County, north of Tampa Bay, Florida. No additional information is available at this time.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR SOUTH AND CENTRAL NEW MEXICO FOR GUSTY WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITIES. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon showers or thunderstorms in the northern part of the state. The southern portion of the state will be mostly sunny. Conditions will be breezy to windy statewide, with west winds 15-30 MPH. Minimum humidities will be 10-20 percent. High temperatures will be in the 50's to 70's for the mountains and 80's to 90's for the southern lowlands.

Northern Florida will be mostly sunny. Southern Florida will be partly cloudy with widely scattered showers or thunderstorms. Winds will be variable at 5-15 MPH. Minimum humidities will be 35-45 percent. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's.

Arizona will be mostly sunny and warm. Minimum humidities will be 10-15 percent in the lower elevations and 15-25 percent in the higher elevations. Winds will be southwest at 15-25 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 50's to 60's in the mountains and mid 70's to upper 80's, with 90's expected in the lowland deserts.

West Texas will be partly cloudy, with a chance of afternoon thunderstorms in the south. Minimum humidities will be 50 to 60 percent. Winds will be southwest to west at 15-25 MPH, with gusts to 30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to 90's, to near 105 along the Rio Grande Corridor.

Michigan will be partly cloudy, with a chance of afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Minimum humidities will be 30-40 percent. Winds will be southeast at 10-20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 70's.

Wisconsin will be partly cloudy with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. Minimum humidities will be 50-60 percent. Winds will be from the south at 10-20 MPH, with high temperatures in the 70's.
