

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, MAY 21, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported in the Southern Area, Nevada, Northwest and Alaska. Resource mobilization through the National Interagency Coordination Center was minimal. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Nevada, New Hampshire, Georgia, southern California, Arizona and New Mexico. Canada also reported very high and extreme indices in the provinces of Prince Edward Island, Quebec and New Brunswick.

ALASKA AREA LARGE FIRES:

EKLUTNA, State of Alaska, Mat-Su Area Forestry. A Type II Incident Management Team (McKnight) is assigned. This fire is located approximately 20 miles northeast of Anchorage. Crews continued to construct line, secure the perimeter and detect hot spots.

OUTLOOK:

Alaska will be mostly sunny with isolated thunderstorms. The gulf coast will be mostly cloudy with a good chance of showers. High temperatures will be 55 to 65 in the interior and 45 to 55 on the coast.

Florida will be sunny in the north, with partly cloudy conditions and scattered thunderstorms in the central and southwest parts of the state. High temperatures will be 85 to 90.

Southern and western New Mexico will be sunny with low humidities. Minimum humidities will be 10-15 percent. Northeastern New Mexico and West Texas will be mostly sunny with slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be 65 to 75 in the mountains and 80's to lower 90's in the lowlands. Arizona will be mostly sunny and breezy. Minimum humidities will be 8-15 percent. Winds will be southwest at 15-25 MPH. High temperatures will be 65 to 75 in the mountains and 85 to 95 in the deserts.

Southern California will be partly cloudy, with a slight chance of mountain showers. High temperatures will be in the 50's to lower 60's in the mountains, and 85 to 95 in the southern deserts.
