INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SATURDAY, MAY 29, 1999 - 0900 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate fire activity was reported in the Southern California, Southern and Southwest Areas, with minor activity reported elsewhere. Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center included airtankers, helicopters, equipment, crews and miscellaneous overhead. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia, California, Arizona, New Mexico and Texas.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. This team is also managing the Hickory Island fire. Suppression efforts are focused on the northwest side of the fire. Ground forces continue to build line in advance of night burnout operations on the northeast corner late yesterday afternoon and the northwest corner last night. Contingency plans are being developed as the fire is within one mile from the community of Baxter, GA.

BAY CREEK COMPLEX, Apalachicola National Forest. No significant activity occurred on the fire yesterday and it received some rain. Full containment was expected last night.

WOLF CREEK, Florida State Division of Forestry. This fire is located in Osceola County. Extensive mop-up occurred yesterday.

OUTLOOK:

Florida will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be easterly at 5 to 15 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's to lower 90's.

Virginia will be sunny with northwest winds at 5 to 10 MPH. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to around 90.

California will be mostly sunny, except for isolated afternoon mountain thunderstorms in the north. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 10 to 20 MPH increasing to 15 to 25 MPH in the afternoon with 20 to 30 MPH on the ridge tops. High temperatures will be in the 90's in the valleys and 100 in the deserts.

Arizona will be mostly sunny with isolated afternoon thunderstorms in the mountains. Winds will be southwest at 5 to 15 MPH increasing to 15 to 25 MPH in the afternoon. High temperatures will be 65 to 85 in the mountains and 90's to 110 in the lower elevations.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening

thunderstorms in the east and north. Winds will be southwest to west at 10 to 20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 60's to 80 in the mountains and to the north, with 80's and lower 90's elsewhere in the state.

West Texas will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's in the mountains to 103 along the Rio Grande.
