INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT THURSDAY, JUNE 3, 1999 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack fire activity was reported in the Southwest Area, while minor activity was reported elsewhere. Large fire activity continued in the Southern, Southwest, and Eastern Areas. Demobilization of crews, aircraft, caterers, showers, miscellaneous overhead, and radio equipment from the Great Basin and Southwest Areas is underway. Four crews will be demobilized within the Southern Area via the NIFC contract jet today. Very high or extreme fire indices were reported in New Mexico, Arizona, west Texas, and Georgia.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. Containment lines around the fire south of Highway 2 continue to be improved by crews. Florida Highway 2 and Georgia Highway 94 remain closed due to heavy smoke and safety concerns. The fire is 8 miles from the communities of Council, Georgia and Benton, Florida. Helicopters and air tankers continued to provide air support.

BROOKEN CREEK, Florida State. This lightning caused fire remains within Pinellas County. No new information was received, this will be the last report unless new information is received.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

CROSSROADS, Arizona State. This fire is 2 miles east of Sonoita, Arizona. Pushed by high winds and flashy fuels, the fire threatened several homes. Six homes were evacuated. Crews concentrated efforts on structure protection yesterday. The fire is burning toward threatened and endangered species on BLM lands. Strong winds hampered containment efforts.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN NEW MEXICO THIS AFTERNOON FOR STRONG SOUTHWEST WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITY ***

New Mexico will be partly cloudy and windy with widely scattered afternoon thunderstorms in the east. Winds will be southwest at 15 to 30 MPH. Temperatures will range from the mid 60s to lower 70s in the mountains and northern part of the state to the mid 80s and mid 90s elsewhere.

Arizona will be fair to partly cloudy and windy. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are possible in the north and central regions. Winds will be south at 20 to 30 MPH with gusts to 40 MPH. Highs will range from 50 to 65 in the north, 75 to 85 in the lower northern valleys and canyons, and from 85 to 95 in the southern deserts.

Florida will be mostly clear in the northern part of the state and mostly cloudy in the south, with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be 5 to 15 MPH and variable. Highs statewide will be 86 to 91.

Minnesota will be partly clouded with isolated to scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be southwest at 10 to 20 MPH. High

temperatures will be in the 70's.

Nevada will be mostly cloudy with showers and scattered thunderstorms in the north and central regions. Snow level will be at 5,500 feet in the west, and near 7,000 feet in the east. Southern Nevada will be partly cloudy and breezy. Winds in the northern part of the state will be 5 to 20 MPH in the valleys and 20 to 30 MPH on ridgetops. In the south, winds will be southwest at 15 to 25 MPH in the valleys and 20 to 30 MPH on ridgetops. Temperatures will be 28 to 50 in the northern mountains, 52 to 65 in the northern valleys, and 68 to 82 in the southern valleys.
