INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT SATURDAY, JUNE 5, 1999 - 0900 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity increased in the Southwest Area. The Southern and Eastern Areas made significant progress on large fires. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed requests for ten Type I crews, three air tankers, a helicopter, a lead plane, miscellaneous overhead, a shower, and a caterer to the Southwest Area fires. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in New Mexico and Arizona.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

LA JARA, Cibola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamonte) is assigned. The fire is burning in thick timber, 10 miles north of Grants, NM. Steep terrain and high winds are hindering control efforts.

WATER CANYON, New Mexico State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Anderson) will be taking over the fire today. This fire is located 12 miles east of Grants, NM. The fire is currently burning northeast toward commercial timber resources. The fire has consumed one unoccupied structure and continues to threaten private land holdings and a wildlife refuge. Winds gusted to 40 MPH on the fire yesterday, preventing crews from building any fireline.

KIOWA, Carson NF. This lightning caused fire is burning in Ponderosa Pine, six miles southwest of Tres Piedras, NM. High winds pushed the fire east- northeast into heavier fuels. Fire activity tapered off overnight as a result of temperatures reaching into the 20's.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRE:

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. Crews are concentrating on construction of the fireline along the edge of the Okefenokee NWR. Thunderstorms passed over the fire yesterday, resulting in several lightning-caused fires nearby. Air resources committed to the fire provided initial attack on the new starts. Fire activity decreased yesterday due to rain associated with the thunderstorms.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

LITTLE TROUT, Superior National Forest. This fire is burning in heavy timber in the eastern part of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. Threats are to resources, power lines and property in the Gunflint Corridor, 1« miles to the east. Crews continued mop-up and a helicopter flew IR for hot spots.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR ALL OF NEW MEXICO, EXCEPT THE SOUTHEAST PORTION, FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITY THIS AFTERNOON ***

New Mexico will be partly cloudy, becoming windy and cooler in most areas. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are forecast for the eastern border and northern part of the state. Winds will be southwest at 20 to 30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the upper 50's to mid 70's in the mountains and northwest, and in the upper 70's to lower 80s in the eastern and southern lowlands.

Southeast Arizona will be sunny to partly cloudy. Highs will be in the mid 50's to 70 degrees in the mountains and 80 to 90 in the lower elevations. Winds will be west to northwest at 10 to 20 MPH.

Northern Florida will be mostly clear, except for isolated afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the lower 90's. Winds will be out of the east at 5 to 15 MPH.

Minnesota will be mostly cloudy in the northern section, with scattered showers and afternoon thunderstorms. Partly cloudy skies with scattered afternoon thunderstorms are forecast for southern Minnesota. Temperatures will be 75 to 82 in the north, and 80 to 85 in the south. Winds will be south to southwest, 10 to 20 MPH.

Colorado will be mostly sunny, becoming partly cloudy and windy in the south central region this afternoon, with isolated thunderstorms. Highs will range from 60 to 70 in the mountains and from 70 to 80 in the lower

elevations. Winds will be south to southwest at 18 to 28 MPH, with gusts to 40 MPH.
