

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY, JUNE 8, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Good progress was made on large fires in the Southwest and Southern Areas. Increased initial attack activity was reported in the Rocky Mountain and California Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for an airtanker, type II helicopter, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Louisiana, Georgia, New Mexico, Arizona and West Texas.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

LA JARA, Cibola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamente) is assigned. The fire is burning in timber 10 miles north of Grants, NM. Mop-up and rehabilitation of control lines has been initiated. Demobilization of excess personnel has begun. Transition to a Type III Incident Management Team is planned for tomorrow.

WATER CANYON, New Mexico State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Anderson) is assigned. This fire is 12 miles east of Grants, NM. Crews conducted burnout operations yesterday. The structure previously reported burned was incorrect.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. Mop-up continues on hotspots observed by the infrared flights. Rehabilitation and demobilization are under way.

RICHARD, Ocala National Forest. This fire is located in Putnam County. Control problems include islands of unburned fuel and reburn in duff areas.

LOSTMAN'S, Everglades National Park. This lightning caused fire is being managed for resource benefits. The fire is burning in the coastal prairie, 26 miles southeast of Everglades City, Florida. This will be the last report unless the fire experiences significant activity.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico will be variably cloudy with isolated afternoon and evening thunderstorms in the east central and southeast parts of the state. The north and west will be fair. High temperatures will be in the high 70's and 80's in the mountains and north, with upper 80's through the 90's in the lower elevations.

Arizona will be sunny. Winds will be south at 15 to 25 MPH with gusts to 35 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 60's to 80's in the mountains and 85 to 103 in the valleys.

Northern Florida will be partly cloudy with a chance of thunderstorms. Winds will be out of the east at 10 to 15 MPH. High temperatures will be 80 to 90.

Minnesota will be partly sunny with a chance of thunderstorms. Winds will be south at 10 to 20 MPH. High temperatures will be 75 to 90.

Colorado will be partly cloudy with isolated thunderstorms. Winds will be southwest at 15 to 30 MPH with gusts to 40 MPH. High temperatures will range from the 60's to 70's in the mountains and from 75 to 85 in the eastern plains.
