

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, JUNE 11, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity occurred in Southern California and Eastern Area. Initial attack activity was minimal elsewhere. Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center included a shower unit, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Demobilization of resources from the Southern and Southwest Areas continues. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in New Mexico, Arizona, West Texas, Nevada, Utah, and Georgia.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

CHAMBERLIN, New Jersey State. This fire is located near Bamber Lake and is burning in the Pine Barrens and Cedar Swamp.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico will be clear to partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms in the northeast and near the Texas border. High temperatures will be in the lower 70's to 80's in the mountains and northwest, and 80's to 90's in the south.

Arizona will be mostly clear. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's to 70's in the mountains, and 90's to 102 in the lowest deserts.

Northern Florida will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be near 85 on the coasts and in the lower 90's inland.

Georgia will experience scattered showers and afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 70's to mid 80's.

New Jersey will be partly cloudy. High temperatures will be in the upper 70's on the coast to mid 80's inland.
