

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, JUNE 18, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity continued in Alaska, the Southwest, Eastern Great Basin, and Northwest Areas. Minimal to moderate initial attack activity occurred elsewhere. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized a smokejumper aircraft, radio equipment, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, West Texas, Southern California, Nevada and Georgia.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

DONNELLY FLATS, Fort Greely Army Base. A Type I Incident Management Team (Stam) is assigned. This fire is ten miles south of Ft. Greely, AK. Fire activity was low with isolated flare ups. Crews concentrated on improving the line and mopping up in areas where structures may be threatened.

MINTO, Upper Yukon Zone BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cowin) is assigned. This fire is near Minto, AK. Cooler wet weather limited fire activity allowing crews to make progress in line construction.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

MT.EMMA, Grand Canyon NP. A Fire Use Management Team (Zimmerman) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. Fire activity was minimal and resource demobilization has begun. A plan to transition the fire back to the park has been approved.

DEAD DOG, Prineville Field Office. This fire is two miles southwest of

Twickenham, OR. The fire is in a monitor status.

KENTUCKY BUTTE, Prineville Field Office. This fire is located three miles north of Twickenham, OR. The fire is burning in grass and juniper on private and BLM land. The fire remains in a monitor status.

BOLDER, Utah State, Northwestern Area. This fire is located approximately twenty-five miles northwest of Salt Lake City. Gusty winds in light fuels contributed to fire spread.

OUTLOOK:

Alaska's interior region will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be southwest at 5 to 10 MPH with gusts near the thunderstorms. High temperatures will be 65 to 75.

Arizona will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be southwest at 15 to 25 MPH with gusts near thunderstorms. Temperatures will be 65 to 85 in the mountains and 85 to 114 in the valleys.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's and lower 80's in the mountains and northeast, and 80's to the lower 90's elsewhere.

Utah will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be southwest at 5 to 15 MPH with gusts to 20 MPH. Highs will be from the 70's to 80's in the mountains, and 90 to 101 in the valleys.
