

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, JUNE 28, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Increased initial attack fire activity was reported in the Rocky Mountain, Eastern Great Basin and California, with minimal activity reported elsewhere. New large fire activity occurred in Southern California. Large fire activity continued in the Southwest and Eastern Great Basin Areas. Mobilization through the National Interagency Coordination Center was minimal. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, and Colorado.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

KINGS CROWN, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. This fire is burning in heavy sage, brush and grass two miles northwest of King Hill, ID. No new information was received, and this will be the last report.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BOX CANYON, Saguaro National Monument. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is 10 miles east of Tucson, AZ. Crews contained the forward spread of the fire into higher terrain. Demobilization continues with the team turning the fire over to the park today. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

COTTONWOOD, San Diego Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. This fire is located in San Diego County. The Cottonwood campground was evacuated. Rapid rates of spread with spotting in heavy fuels were

reported. Hot and dry east winds are causing control problems.

OUTLOOK:

Utah will be sunny. High temperatures will be in the 70's to 80's in the mountains and 90's to 105 in the lower elevations.

Nevada will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will range from the mid 70's to mid 80's in the mountains, 85 to 95 in the northern valleys, and 100 to 112 in the southern valleys.

Southern Idaho will be mostly sunny, becoming partly cloudy in the afternoon in the mountains. High temperatures will range from the 70's in the mountains to the mid 80's in the valleys.

Arizona will be sunny and hot. High temperatures will be in the 80's to 90's in the higher elevations and 108 to 117 in the lower valleys.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms except in the central valleys and northwest. High temperatures will range from the 70's to 80's in the mountains and the northeast, with 90's to 105 in the lower elevations.

Northern California will be sunny. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coastal areas and up to the mid 90's inland.
