

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 TUESDAY, JUNE 29, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack fire activity was reported in the Rocky Mountain, Eastern Great Basin and California areas, with minimal activity reported elsewhere. New large fire activity occurred in the Great Basin and Rocky Mountain areas. Large fire activity continued in the Southern California, Southwest and Eastern Great Basin areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized an engine, smokejumpers, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. A fire in Garfield County, Colorado near the community of Battlement Mesa caused about two hundred residents to evacuate their homes. The brush fire, fueled by dry vegetation and high winds, destroyed nine homes and damaged several others Sunday afternoon. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, and Colorado.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BRAMIERS, Montrose District BLM. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is one mile southwest of Naturia, CO. The fire is burning east and away from Naturita in an old pinion juniper stand.

SOUTH SEWEMUP, Grand Junction District BLM. Crews are making good progress, expecting containment today.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

KINGS RIVER, Winnemucca Field Office BLM. This fire is near Orvada, NV. No problems are expected with containment and control objectives.

COLD SPRINGS, Carson City Field Office BLM. This fire is 60 miles east of Fallon, NV. The fire is burning in sage, grass, and pinion juniper. The fire has burned through a private communication site.

NAVAJO MTN 1, Navajo Area Office BIA. This fire is fifteen miles east of Page, AZ. Suppression efforts are hampered by steep terrain.

CATARACT, Arizona State Land Department. This fire is thirty-five miles northwest of Williams, AZ. The fire is burning in pinion juniper and logging slash. The fire is being managed under a modified suppression plan.

OUTLOOK:

Utah will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be 72 to 88 in the mountains and 88 to 104 in the lower elevations.

Nevada will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be 60 to 85 in the higher elevations, and 85 to 115 in the lower elevations.

Southern Idaho will be partly cloudy. High temperatures will be 70 to 80 in the mountains and 80 to 85 in the lower elevations.

Arizona will be sunny. High temperatures will be 78 to 88 in the higher elevations and 88 to 118 in the lower elevations.

New Mexico will be mostly clear becoming partly cloudy with widely scattered thunderstorms in the mountains and eastern plains. High temperatures will range from the 70's to 80's in the mountains, with 90 to 100 in the lower elevations.

Northern California will be sunny. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coastal areas and up to 108 inland.

Western Colorado will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the higher elevations and 85 to 95 in the lower elevations.
