

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 THURSDAY, JULY 1, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack fire activity was reported in Nevada and California, with minimal activity reported elsewhere. New large fire activity occurred in the Western Great Basin. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized tactical aircraft and smokejumpers to the Western Great Basin. High to extreme fire indices were reported in Nevada, California, Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Colorado, Alaska, Connecticut, Rhode Island, and New Jersey.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

MOHAGANY, Ely Field Office BLM. This fire is located east of Pioche, NV. Poor road access, heavy fuels and steep terrain are hampering suppression efforts.

PIOCHE, Ely Field Office BLM. A Type III Incident Management Team is assigned. This fire is burning just north of Pioche, NV. Two outbuildings and a camp trailer were destroyed.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRE:

BRAMIERS, Montrose District BLM. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning southwest of Naturia, CO. No significant fire behavior or growth was reported yesterday.

SOUTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

TURKEY, Coconino National Forest. This lightning caused fire is located 45 miles southeast of Flagstaff, AZ and is in confine status. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

NAVAJO MTN. 1, Navajo Area Office BIA. This fire is fifteen miles east of Page, AZ. A helicopter is supporting the fire and mop-up is progressing.

CATARACT, Arizona State Land Department. This fire is 35 miles northwest of Williams, AZ. The fire is burning in pinion juniper and logging slash. The fire is being managed under a modified suppression plan. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

OUTLOOK:

*** A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR THE NORTHERN SACRAMENTO VALLEY AND FOOTHILLS TO 2500 FEET IN CALIFORNIA FOR WINDS, LOW HUMIDITY, AND WARM TEMPERATURES ***

Northern California will be mostly sunny, except for patchy fog and low clouds on the coast. Winds will be north 8 to 18 MPH in most areas, except in the Sierra, where winds will be west at 15 to 30 MPH with gusts to 40 MPH. Highs in the lower elevations will be 82 to 102. Temperatures in the higher elevations will be 63 to 85.

Southern California will be sunny. Highs will be in the 80's in the higher

elevations, and 95 to 105 in the inland valleys. Southern desert temperatures will be 107 to 111.

Nevada will be sunny and breezy. Winds will be southwest to west at 15 to 30 MPH with some gusts to 40 MPH in the mountains. High temperatures will be 63 to 84 in the higher elevations, and 85 to 105 in the lower elevations, except near Lake Mead, where the high will reach 117.

Utah will be sunny and breezy, with west winds locally gusting 20 to 35 MPH. Highs will be 77 to 87 in the higher elevations, and 88 to 107 in the valleys. Western Colorado will be partly cloudy on the northwest plateau, and mostly sunny elsewhere. Winds will be west to southwest at 15 to 25 MPH, with gusts to 35 MPH on the ridges. Highs in the mountains will be 75 to 87, while in lower elevations the highs will be between 88 and 96.

Arizona will be sunny, with south to southwest winds at 15 to 25 MPH in the northwest part of the state, gusting to 35 MPH. High temperatures will be 82 to 92 in the higher elevations, and 93 to 118 in the lower elevations.
