

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 SATURDAY, JULY 24, 1999 - 0900 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported in most Areas. New large fires occurred in the Great Basin and the Rocky Mountain Areas. Good progress was made on large fires in the Great Basin, California, Northern Rockies and the Northwest Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized infrared aircraft, air attack aircraft, lead planes, helicopters, radio equipment, supplies, caterers, shower units, crews and miscellaneous overhead. High to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Washington, California, Montana, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Wyoming and New Jersey.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

SPANISH, Santa Barbara County Fire Department, California. A Type II Incident Management Team (Smith) is assigned. This fire is eighteen miles west of Cuyama, California on Spanish Ranch. Several ranch structures and communications equipment at the Plow share Peak Communications Site are threatened. Spotting and strong, gusty winds are hampering suppression efforts.

GOAT, Los Angeles County Fire Department, California. This fire is on Catalina Island, northwest of the Airport in the Sky. Current threats are watershed and the Airport in the Sky.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

EIGHT MILE, Salmon/Challis National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Casey) is assigned. The fire is twenty miles west of Challis, ID. No other information was reported.

SOLDIER, Salmon/Challis National Forest. A Fire Use Management Team (Wallace) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning thirty miles northwest of Stanley, Idaho. The Incident Management Team is also managing the Blue Bunch fire on the Payette National Forest. Fisheries, historic structures and the Middle Fork of the Salmon River Corridor are threatened.

CEDAR BUTTE, Upper Snake River District, BLM. The fire is twenty five miles northwest of Blackfoot, Idaho. No other information was reported.

BLACK MESA, Lower Snake River District, BLM. This fire is five miles south of Glens Ferry, ID. The fire is expected to be contained today.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

BURNED POINT, Lewis and Clark National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Bennett) is assigned. This fire is twenty miles south of Augusta, MT. The fire is burning in grass and timber. Private land east of the fire is threatened. Strong winds and low relative humidities are creating control problems.

TIN, Lewistown Field Office, BLM. This fire is twenty miles from Winnett, MT. High winds, low relative humidity and high temperatures are hampering suppression efforts.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

SAND SPRINGS, Carson City Field Office, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Vorce) is assigned. This fire is fifty miles east of Fallon, NV. Strong, gusty winds continue to cause control problems. The Fairview Peak communications site is secure. Communication and power lines leading to the site have been severely damaged. Power is being supplied to the site by generators. The town of Middlegate is threatened.

WAGON BOX, Elko Field Office, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Carr) is assigned. This fire is fifteen miles northwest of Grouse Creek, UT. A successful burnout operation was completed on the evening of 7/22. Isolated torching was observed yes terday.

LOCKWOOD, Northwest Nevada State. This fire is five miles east of Reno, NV. The fire is burning in grass, sage, and Pinon-Juniper. Strong,

shifting winds are creating control problems.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN LARGE FIRES:

ISLAND PARK, Big Horn National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hartman) is assigned. This fire is fifteen miles northeast of Tensleep, Wyoming burning in Lodgepole Pine and Spruce. Three seasonal structures and the Island Park Campground are threatened. Spotting and torching occurred in medium to heavy fuels.

Crews are still working on the South Kaibab Trail and reconstructing retaining walls on the North Kaibab Trail.

Montana will be partly with isolated, mainly dry afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be west to northwest 10 to 20 MPH, increasing in the afternoon to 15 to 25 MPH with higher gusts. High temperatures will be 75 to 90 degrees.

Wyoming will be partly cloudy and breezy, with isolated, mainly dry afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be west to southwest 15 to 25 MPH, with gusts around 30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 70's to around 93 degrees.

Utah will be mostly sunny to partly cloudy with isolated to scattered thunderstorms over the mountains, and mainly dry thunderstorms in the western and northern zones.

Idaho will be partly cloudy, cooler and locally breezy. There will be isolated to scattered afternoon thunderstorms with some showers. Winds will be southwest to northwest 10 to 25 MPH, with gusts to 30 MPH. High temperatures will range from the mid 60's to the 80's.

Washington, Oregon, northern California and northern Nevada will be a little cooler and locally breezy. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will occur in Washington and Oregon. The southwest will have little change with scattered mainly wet thunderstorms in the Four Corners area. Elsewhere will be mostly clear. High temperatures will range from the 60's to mid 70's in the coastal areas, mid 60's to mid 80's in the mountains and 90 to 102 in the inland valleys.
