

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, MAY 20, 2000 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Southern Area. Initial attack activity was moderate in the Southern Area, light in the rest of the nation. Large fires in the Southwest Area are approaching containment goals, and a Type I Incident Management Team was demobilized. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a lead plane, infrared aircraft, radio equipment, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in New Mexico, Arizona, California, Utah, Texas, Oklahoma, and Minnesota.

On 5/13, Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt and Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman announced a 30-day suspension of all federal prescribed fires west of the 100th meridian. For more information, see the U.S. Forest Service Fire web page at www.fs.fed.us/fire/news.shtml.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

CERRO GRANDE, Bandelier National Monument. An Area Command Team (Meuchel) and a Type I Incident Management Teams (Gage) are assigned. The fire is near Los Alamos, NM. Fire intensity decreased as cloudy and cooler conditions prevailed. Construction of direct fireline over the Caballo Mountains on the west side of the fire is continuing. Crews have completed an indirect contingency fireline on the Baca Ranch. The two zones of this fire have been consolidated.

OUTLET, Grand Canyon National Park. A Type I Incident Management Team (Frye) is assigned. The fire is burning in designated and proposed wilderness 25 miles south of Jacob Lake, AZ. Continued favorable weather aided crews in completing fireline along the northwest flank. Mop up and rehabilitation are progressing on the western and southeastern portions of the fire. The North Rim structure protection group has been released.

LEWIS SPRINGS, Safford-Tucson Field Office, BLM. The fire is near Escalupe, AZ in Cochise County. One structure was destroyed. Containment was expected last night.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

LONG BAY, National Forests of Florida. A Type II Incident Management Team

(Wilkins) is assigned. The fire is in the Apalachicola National Forest, 40 miles southwest of Tallahassee, FL. A burnout operation has been successfully completed. Mop up of hot spots along control lines continues.

CARLTON RESERVE, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is ten miles northwest of Port Charlotte, FL. Some spotting has been observed. Crews are mopping up 100 feet in from the fireline.

CANEY BOTTOM, National Forests in North Carolina. This fire is 22 miles northwest of Burnsville, NC. Crews will continue mop up operations and begin rehabilitation work today.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN NORTHEAST AND CENTRAL FLORIDA FOR LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITIES ***

Florida will be partly cloudy with widely scattered showers and thunderstorms in the panhandle. The northwest part of the state will have patchy morning fog. Winds will be southeast to southwest at 5 to 15 mph. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to lower 90's. Afternoon relative humidities will be 30 to 50 percent.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms in the northern and central mountains. There is a slight chance of thunderstorms in the southern part of the state. High temperatures will range from the 60's in the northern mountains to near 90 in the southern deserts. Winds will be southwest 10 to 20 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 20 to 30 percent.

Arizona will be mostly sunny and warmer. Temperatures will be in the mid 60's in the northern mountains and up to 105 in the southern deserts. Winds will be east to south at 5 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 8 to 18 percent.

West Texas will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be from the 70's in the northern part of the state to the lower 90's along the Rio Grande. Winds will be south to southeast at 5 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 25 to 37 percent.

North and South Carolina will be mostly cloudy in the north and mostly sunny in the south. There is a chance for afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to mid 90's. Winds will be southwest to west at 10 to 15 mph.
