

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, JUNE 26, 2000 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Alaska, Western Great Basin, Eastern Great Basin, Northwest, and Southern Areas. Initial attack was fairly active in Alaska, Nevada, Florida, California, and Utah. Forecasted lightning in the Great Basin may cause an increase in fire activity there today. Alaska is monitoring 23 limited protection fires for 22,230 acres. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized an airtanker, a lead plane, radio equipment, engines, crews, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, California, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Kansas, Wyoming, Florida, and Maryland.

ALASKA AREA LARGE FIRES:

CLEAR, Fairbanks Area, Alaska State Division of Forestry. A Type II Incident Management Team (McKnight) is assigned. This lightning-caused fire is 20 miles southwest of Nenana. The fire is burning in black spruce and high winds are hampering containment efforts.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

5TH AVE, Vale District BLM. The fire is ten miles north of Vale, OR. Local rural fire departments are assisting in protecting 11 threatened structures. Observed fire behavior included 25 foot flame lengths.

HARPHAM, Prineville District BLM. This fire is burning in grass, sagebrush and juniper three miles southeast of Maupin, OR. Gusty winds have caused containment challenges. Harpham Flat Campground was reopened yesterday evening.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

DEAN COMMAND, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is near Lakeland, FL in Polk County. This lightning-caused fire is in an inaccessible swamp area. Control problems include unpredictable fire behavior and thunderstorms in the fire area. Houses and equipment are threatened.

MUSE COMMAND, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is east of St. Cloud, FL in Osceola County. The fire received rain yesterday and crews are making good progress toward containment.

WILDCOW, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is in Hendry County near Felda, FL. No new information was received. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

OUTLOOK:

For the western United States there will be scattered afternoon and evening showers and thunderstorms from the Sierra Nevada through central Nevada and all of Utah. Showers and thunderstorms will also spread into southwest Wyoming. These storms will mostly be wet with locally heavy rain possible but the exception will be in northern Nevada and northern Utah, where thunderstorms could be dry. Washington, Oregon and Idaho will be sunny and warm. Temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the north and up to 110 in the southern deserts. Minimum relative humidities will be around 50 percent along the west coast, and from 10 to 30 percent inland. Winds will be south to northwest at 10 to 20 mph.

Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to mid 90's. Winds will be southeast to southwest at 5 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 45 to 55 percent.
