INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT TUESDAY, MAY 15, 2001 - 0530 MDT NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was moderate in the Southern Area and light elsewhere. Two new large fires were reported in the Southern Area and one large fire was contained in the Northern Rockies. Florida will be dry and partly cloudy. The Southwest will be warm, with enough moisture and instability for thunderstorms over the mountains. Northwest Nevada will have a chance of showers with the rest of the area remaining dry. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Florida, Nevada, and Texas.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

SIEGEL, Carson City Field Office, BLM. This fire is burning in grass, sagebrush and thick pinyon pine and juniper seven miles east of Gardnerville, NV. Firelines continue to hold. Islands of unburned fuel and steep terrain continue to hamper mopup operations. Due to forecasted winds, the containment date has been moved back.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

LOPEZ, Everglades National Park. The fire is burning in moderate to heavy fuels one mile west of the Homestead airport. Resources continue to patrol fire perimeter. Burnout operations are being conducted to improve firelines.

HURST HAMMOCK, Florida Division of Forestry. The fire spread rapidly. Low humidity and swampy areas are hindering containment efforts.

OAK, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is eight miles south of Inverness, FL. Spotting continues to challenge crews in their containment efforts. State Road 48 was closed due to heavy smoke.

CRAWFORD ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. Containment efforts were hampered by spotting, wind shifts and low relative humidity. Air resources provided crews with assistance.

GREATER GROVES, Florida Division of Forestry. This human-caused fire is in Lake County, Florida. Crews continue with mopup efforts.

A-78, Eglin Air Force Base. This fire is in Okaloosa County, FL and was mission-caused. The fire is burning in longleaf, scrub oak and wiregrass. Crews continue with mopup and monitoring containment lines.

HEMATITE COMPLEX, George Washington and Jefferson National Forests. This fire is near Covington, VA. Crews continue with mop-up and rehabilitation efforts are being planned.

OUTLOOK:

High pressure will keep Florida dry and partly cloudy. High temperatures will reach 85 to 90 and minimum relative humidity will be 28 to 38 percent. Winds will be south to west at 5 to 15 mph.

High pressure over Arizona and New Mexico will keep temperatures warm, with enough moisture and instability for isolated afternoon thunderstorms over the mountains. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains and 90 to 100 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range 8 to 18 percent in the deserts and 20 to 30 percent in the mountains. Winds will be west at 10 to 20 mph in the afternoon.

A Pacific trough will bring a chance of showers to northwest Nevada. The remainder of the area will be dry and breezy. High temperatures will be in the mid 70's to lower 80's. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 20 percent. Winds will be west at 15 to 25 mph with gusts to 35 mph.
