

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
MONDAY, JULY 16, 2001 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Seven new large fires were reported, one in Western Great Basin and six in Eastern Great Basin. Eight large fires were contained, six in Eastern Great Basin and one each in the Northwest and Western Great Basin Areas. Initial attack activity continued to be heavy in Eastern Great Basin, northern California and Northwest Areas. Activity was light elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Minnesota, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BALD PETER, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Jackson) is assigned. This fire is burning in thick stands of beetle killed lodgepole pine 12 miles northwest of Camp Sherman, OR. Steep terrain is a major containment problem and falling snags continue to be a safety concern. Wind speeds have increased over the area as low pressure approaches the Pacific Northwest.

THIRTY MILE #103, Okanogan National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Stutler) is assigned. This human-caused fire is burning in logging slash and continuous stands of timber 20 miles north of Winthrop, WA. Fireline construction and improvement continues on the north, east and south flanks. Limited fire growth occurred due to lower temperatures and increased relative humidity.

DOG CREEK, Wenatchee National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This fire is 11 miles southwest of Clifdell, WA. Cooler temperatures and increased relative humidity are assisting in containment. Access to the fire is impeding containment efforts.

LIBBY SOUTH, Northeast Washington State. A Washington Interagency Incident Management Team (Dunton/Gormley) is assigned. This human caused fire is 15 miles south of Twisp, WA. Fireline construction, burn out operations and mop up continues.

PORCUPINE BAY, Northeast Washington State. A Washington Interagency Incident Management Team (Ariss/Graue) is assigned. This fire is 30 miles northeast of Spokane, WA. Mopup operations continue.

ROCK CREEK, Prineville District, BLM. This fire is comprised of two fires, one on each side of the John Day River, and is burning in grass, sagebrush and juniper 14 miles east of Wasco, OR. Monitoring of this fire continues.

STARVATION RIDGE, Prineville District, BLM. This fire is five miles west of Olex, OR. Patrol of containment lines continues.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FORT RANCH, Northwest State, Utah State. This fire is north of Promontory Mountain, UT. Significant winds pushed the fire across established containment lines. Golden Spike Monument was evacuated and structure protection actions were initiated.

THIOKOL, Northwest State, Utah State. This fire is burning in light flashy fuels east of Thiokol, UT. Burn out operations are being utilized in containment efforts.

BLACK MOUNTAIN, Richfield Field Office, BLM. This fire is ten miles north of Lynndyl, UT. Flame lengths of eight to ten feet were observed. High winds and low relative humidity are impeding containment efforts.

WORTHINGTON, Sawtooth National Forest. This fire is 16 miles southwest of Oakley, ID. Active fire behavior was observed in the initial phase. Precipitation received reduced fire spread and mopup is occurring.

MAIN HEGLAR, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. This fire is near Burley, ID.

JONES HOLLOW, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. No new informaion was received.

SAND HOLLOW, Lower Snake River District, BLM. This lightning ignited fire is ten miles east of New Plymouth, ID.

HORSE CANYON, Las Cruces Field Office, BLM. This lightning caused fire is 8 miles west of Hatch, NM. No new information was received.

PINE, Prescott National Forest. This fire is in the Pine Mountain Wilderness, 18 miles southeast of Camp Verde, AZ. No new information was received. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

OUTLOOK:

*** A RED FLAG WARNING HAS BEEN POSTED IN NORTH-CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN NEVADA FOR STRONG SOUTHWEST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY ***

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED IN WESTERN AND CENTRAL UTAH FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY ***

A trough moving inland to the north will cause isolated thundershowers in the northern third of Nevada, with dry southwest winds to the south. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's to mid 80's in the north and central portions and 100 to 107 across the south. Minimum relative humidity will range from 16 to 30 percent north and 7 to 21 percent south. Winds will be southwest at 20 to 30 mph with some higher gusts.

An upper level trough over the Pacific Northwest with a strong dry southwest flow over the Great Basin will bring partly cloudy skies with

isolated thunderstorms, mainly in Idaho and eastern Utah. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the mountains and mostly 80 to 90 elsewhere. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 30 percent, except for 5 to 15 percent in western and central Utah. Winds will be south to southwest, gusting up to 40 to 50 mph over western and central Utah. Elsewhere, winds will be south to west at 10 to 20 mph.

A trough of low pressure aloft is settling over the Pacific Northwest bringing mostly cloudy skies west of the Cascades with a few light showers at times. The eastside will be partly cloudy north to sunny south with light showers possible over higher terrain. High temperatures will be in the mid 50's and 60's in western Washington and northwest Oregon, with 60's in the mountains and 70's in the valleys in the interior. Minimum relative humidity will be above 50 percent west of the Cascade Crest in Washington and Oregon and 25 to 35 percent east. Winds will be west to northwest with some gusts up to 25 mph on the east slopes of the Cascades and Columbia River Gorge and lighter elsewhere.
