

**INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 2002- 1000 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1**

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was moderate in the Southern Area, with three new large fires reported. The Holy fire was contained this week in the Southern California Area. Prescribed burning projects continued in Northern California, the Eastern and Southern Areas.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

PARTIN, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is located near St. Cloud, Florida. Fire activity has been light.

OUTLOOK:

A cold front moves slowly off the Atlantic Coast on Saturday as high pressure builds in from the southern plains. The high will bring a period of cool and dry weather for several days to the Southern Area. On Monday, a weak system in the Great Lakes Region will bring some light snow to Kentucky and some rain across the Tennessee valleys. Another storm system will develop in the Ozark Mountains and track northeast through the Ohio River Valley. This system will bring a snowy period to Kentucky, Virginia, eastern Tennessee and western North Carolina beginning on Saturday and continuing through Monday. Highs will generally be on the cool side with 40s for North Carolina, Virginia, Tennessee, Kentucky and South Carolina with 50s elsewhere. A few 60s will be seen in south Texas and Florida. Northwest winds at 15 to 25 mph will predominate most of

the area as a low pressure system deepens off the Pennsylvania coast. Minimum relative humidity will fall below 35 percent across Texas, Oklahoma and the Florida panhandle through Sunday and should recover by Monday.
